CHPAS and the City of Cheyenne Parks and Recreation staff have identified the following 18 species for this area that will bloom throughout the growing season and provide foraging opportunities to a wide variety of pollinators and birds.

Genus and species	Common name	Bloom time
<i>Gaillardia aristata</i>	Blanket flower	June through October
<i>Rudbeckia hirta</i>	Black-eyed Susan	June to Oct
<i>Aquilegia coerulea</i>	Columbine	June/July to Sept
<i>Rudbeckia laciniata</i>	Cut-leaf coneflower	July to Oct
<i>Liatris punctata</i>	Dotted Blazing Star	July/Aug to Sept
<i>Astragalus tridactylus</i>	Foothills milkvetch	May to June
<i>Agastache Blue Boa</i>	Giant hyssop	May/June to Oct
<i>Sphaeralcea munroana</i>	Globemallow	May to August
<i>Echinacea angustifolia</i>	Narrow-leaved coneflower	June to Aug/Sept
Multiple species	Penstemon	May to July
<i>Mertensia lanceolata</i>	Prairie bluebells	April to May
<i>Dalea candida</i>	Prairie clover, white	Late June through Aug
<i>Ratibida columnifera</i>	Prairie coneflower/Mexican hat	May/June through Sept
<i>Echinacea purpurea</i>	Purple coneflower	June to Sept
<i>Salvia nemorosa</i>	Salvia	May/June to Sept
<i>Asclepias speciosa</i>	Showy milkweed	Early June to Sept
<i>Coreopsis lanceolata</i>	Tickseed	May to Aug
<i>Achillea millefolium</i>	Yarrow	May/June to Sept/Oct
